HAVE YOU HEARD? The Prayer Chair

A man's daughter had asked the local minister to come and pray with her father. When the minister arrived, he found the man lying in bed with his head propped up on two pillows. An empty chair sat beside his bed.

The minister assumed that the old fellow had been informed of his visit. "I guess you were expecting me," he said. "No, who are you?" said the father. "I'm the new minister at your church," he replied. "When I saw the empty chair, I figured you knew I was going to show up." "Oh yeah, the chair," said the bedridden man. "Would you mind closing the door?"

Puzzled, the minister shut the door. "I have never told anyone this, not even my daughter," said the man. "But all of my life I have never known how to pray. At church I used to hear the pastor talk about prayer, but it went right over my head. I abandoned any attempt at prayer," the old man continued, "until one day, about four years ago, my best friend said to me, 'Joe, prayer is just a simple matter of having a conversation with Jesus.

Here is what I suggest. Sit down in a chair; place an empty chair in front of you, and in faith see Jesus on the chair. It's not spooky because He promised, "I'll be with you always." Then, just speak to Him in the same way you're doing with me right now.'

So, I tried it, and I've liked it so much that I do it a couple of hours every day. I'm careful though. If my daughter saw me talking to an empty chair, she'd either have a nervous breakdown or send me off to the funny farm."

"Did he die in peace?" he asked. "Yes, when I left the house about two o' clock, he called me over to his bedside, told me he loved me and kissed me on the cheek. When I got back from the store an hour later, I found him dead. But there was something strange about his death. Apparently, just before Dad died, he leaned over and rested his head on the chair beside the bed. What do you make of that?"

The minister wiped a tear from his eye and said, "I wish we could all go like that."

If you have difficulty praying, why not try what Joe did – and rest your head on Jesus' breast. it works!

Lest we forget.....

Pictures have a wonderful way of transporting us to the exact moment that it was taken. I want to share some photographs of two trips I have been on recently, both profound in different ways.



The first image is taken a few years ago whilst on a trip to Belgium to visit various sites, museums and monuments in remembrance of the First World War. The first picture was taken just outside the village of Ypres in the province of Flanders, in one of many

thousands of war cemeteries. A stark reminder of countless lives lost during that war.

The whole trip was an extremely moving experience. This poignant image of the mighty oak with it



deep roots making it so resilient and strong, standing tall there in the middle of the graves of all those brave soldiers who sacrificed their lives for their countries so we might have freedom and peace.



The second image is from my trip with my colleagues from Exeter Diocese to Israel in January of this year.

This was taken whilst experiencing the peace and serenity of Lake Galilee on a boat trip. It was not only a pilgrimage as we visited the Holy Land, tracing the footsteps of Jesus, but also a study trip, as we explored the tensions that exist between the Israelis and the Palestinians.

As Remembrance Day approaches, many of us will wear a poppy which has become the symbol of remembrance. When in Belgium, we had the privilege of visiting Flanders Fields War Museum, which commemorates Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, who wrote



the famous poem, 'In Flanders Fields'. Shortly after losing a friend in battle, he was inspired to write it as he saw Poppies growing in the battle scarred fields. Something so beautiful springing up in the midst of something so awful.

There will be Remembrance services held at all of our churches. Please do join us at one of them if you are able to, as we stand alongside many millions across the nation in the act of remembrance on Sunday 12th November at 11am.

Some will lay wreaths, others will place a cross with a poppy on it, which symbolically brings together the sacrifice made by the soldiers in all of the conflicts and wars and the ultimate sacrificial act

of love made by Jesus on the cross. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life". John 3:16

As we remember, this November, all those who have lost their lives in war and conflict over the years, let those countries such as Ukraine and



Israel and other countries that lay heavy on our hearts, where war rages on, remain in our thoughts. Let us unite to pray for an end to the fighting and pray for peace.



- 1st. <u>Philippians 3 V 13:</u> 'Forgetting those things which are behind reach forward to those which are ahead.' In doing this, God will give you the grace and peace to move on after leaving behind any guilt, condemnation, shame or regret for which God has forgiven you & set you free.
- **2nd.** <u>Psalm 100 V 2:</u> 'Serve the Lord with gladness.' To grow your relationship with God, it is desirable to move from the 'Should' to the 'Want to' state of mind, enabling you to enjoy spending time with God being honest with him & giving you the joy & enthusiasm to serve him faithfully.
- **3rd.** Hebrews 12 V 1-2: 'Let us run keeping our eyes on Jesus,' He who initiates & perfects our faith. For us to endure the race that is set before us, knowing that Jusus endured the cross for us, to attain the joy of being seated with the Father, & We to join him in his Kingdom.
- **4th.** <u>2 Corinthians 10 V 12:</u> 'By measuring themselves & comparing with others they were <u>un</u>wise. Aim NOT to lift yourself up by putting someone else down. We don't get to heaven based on our performance, but on Christ's performance on the Cross. We have no right to judge the character, heart, motives or spirituality of others.
- **5**th. Exodus 33 V 14: God reassured Moses 'My presence will go with you and I will give you rest.' When stress overwhelms you, delegate tasks to qualified people you can trust to do them. Draw on God's strength rather than your own He will give you the inner peace, well-being & confidence.
- **6**th. <u>Isaiah 30 V 21:</u> 'Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying" This is the way, walk in it." 'God has a strategic plan for each of our lives & through waiting on him, reading HIS word, listening to him not others, God will reveal it to you just as he had a plan for Jesus' life to redeem mankind. Seek to know God's will through prayer, trust & guidance.
- **7th.** <u>Matthew 18 V 3:</u> 'Unless you change & become like little children, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven.' To do great things for God, you should approach Him with a childlike attitude. Jesus teaches us to have a simple & trusting faith- to pray simple prayers to be quick to repent & to forgive to reach regularly for God's help & so to grow spiritually.

- **8th.** Exodus 18 V 23: Moses followed his father in law's advice, 'You will then be able to endure the pressures.' Before you devote time, energy & emotion to an issue consider how important it is how much effort is needed focus on what really matters, & decide to avoid stress & strain.
- **9th.** Psalm 107 V 9: 'He satisfies the--- hungry with good things.' Society teaches us that it is impossible to succeed without going through adversity. The acid test of character is determined by what it takes to persevere in God's service & so find success, rather than getting discouraged & quitting.
- **10th.** Proverbs 12 V 11: 'A hard worker has plenty of food, but one who chases fantasies has no sense.' Hard work & integrity two qualities go together, & are the essence of a life well lived. When you practise them to the best of your ability, you can expect to experience the highest level of joy & fulfilment in life.
- **11th.** Nehemiah 6 V 3: 'I am carrying on a great project & cannot go down' said he to his enemies, vowing to stay focussed on what mattered, & refused to be distracted. A lesson for us to decide what are our biggest priorities for each day to settle on those & pursue our God-given assignments.
- **12th.** 2 Kings 3 V 8: The king said, 'which way shall we go up? Jehoram answered The way through the wilderness. 'In our life experiences the things that cause us to stumble in our walk with God are permitted to die. It is where we learn to stand in faith, & where God tries to get our attention, & talk to us about His calling on our life.
- **13th.** <u>1 Thessalonians 5 V 18:</u> 'In everything give thanks for this is the Will of God for you. 'Gratitude does not always come naturally to us, but grumbling does. Recall what God has done in your life. In spite of obstacles & disappointments, be thankful for his abundant blessings & grace.
- **14th.** <u>John 15 V 12:</u> Jesus said 'This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you. 'This is challenging which demands us growing & maturing in order to keep it. God created people with different temperaments & personalities, some of whom can cause us frustration & annoyance. May God help us to love them.

- **15th.** Romans 15 V 13: May the God of hope fill you with all joy & peace as you trust in Him. 'Do you doubt His promises, His call on your life, your ability to hear from him, His pleasure in you?—if so regain your trust in God stop doubting your salvation, yourself or God.
- **16th.** Psalm 119 V 166: 'I do your commandments,' but it is easy to find reasons to delay our obedience I will go, when---I will give,---after I will act & obey---but first. Pray for the courage to step out in faith be doers of God's Word, NOT hearers only, = James 1 V 22.
- 17th. <u>John 5 V 6</u>: Jesus asked a sick man 'Do you want to get well? 'For us in the sense of having suffered hurt from someone & how we react. Forgiveness is key. Make amends, turn bitterness into a forgiving attitude as Jesus has forgiven us for our sins,=Mark 11 V 25.
- **18**th. Matthew 25 v 21: 'Well done, thou good and faithful servant.' We get to choose what our legacy will be what we will be remembered for. If our life's sole focus is self-interest we may not be missed! Aim to follow a lifestyle, and cause, greater than ourselves, one that will outlive us. **19**th. Genesis 1 v 31: 'God saw everything that he had made, and behold it was good,' including ourselves, and since then He hasn't changed His mind. We should be patient, because He is not through with His creative work in our lives, and wants us to see ourselves as He sees us.
- **20**th. Acts 4 v 31: 'When they had prayed, the place was shaken.' The disciples were threatened by the religious authorities If we are in an intimidating situation: Bring God into the picture; pray for greater faith; call God and expect Him to intervene, and be strengthened by God's power.
- 21^{st} . <u>Joshua 3 v 5</u>: 'Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you,' as His people were on the threshold of the promised land. Consecration is an ever-deepening love for Jesus, a child-like trust in our Heavenly Father, and a steadfast obedience to the Holy Spirit.
- **22**nd. Acts 26 v 17: God promises Paul to deliver him from the people to whom He now sends him.' For ourselves to be freed from the fear of people and pleasing them, but to be determined to do God's Will, sharing with them the Gospel whether or not they accept or reject it.

- **23**rd. Mark 11 v 23: 'Jesus says, whoever says to this mountain be removed in faith believe, and things will happen. 'Aim to stand on God's promise that 'mountains' in your life will move and come down, even as you do not know how or when but in faith it WILL happen.
- **24**th. <u>1 John 2 v 27</u>: 'The anointing which you have received from Him abides in you.' In other words we are containers for God's Spirit, who affects every area of our lives:- in our relationships, careers, decisions and struggles, when we are under stress and handling problems. Further-more, the anointing abiding in us is transferable to others.
- **25**th. <u>Luke 6 v 28</u>: 'Pray for those who spitefully use you,' implying that you did nothing to cause or deserve being hurt, and for reasons you may never understand. When you decide to forgive someone and pray for them, you take back your power and reclaim your life.
- **26**th. <u>Luke 17 v 10</u>: 'Jesus to his disciples that they should say 'We have done what was our duty.' When we don't receive appreciation, we can succumb to self-pity and complain how the world is treating us give way to resentment, or adopt Jesus' teaching to say "I am only doing what God expects of me". May we remember WHO we are serving and where our real reward comes from.
- **27**th. <u>Joshua 4 v 21</u>: saying to the Israelites in Gilgal 'What do these stones from the Jordan mean?' which their children will ask expecting an answer. It will be a teaching moment about God's love and faithfulness. We ask God to help <u>us</u> recognise moments to teach others.
- 28th. Ephesians 4 v 26: 'Don't sin by letting anger control you.' Hostility and anger can harm others as well as ourselves often leading to fatal consequences. The word ANGER is one letter short of the word DANGER. 29th. James 4 v 7: 'Submit...... to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.' When
- we are filled with the Spirit, He will fight in us, through us and for us stopping satan on that front, but he will attack on another. With enough resistance training, we can experience the joy and victory of overcoming our adversary.
- 30^{th} . <u>Luke 15 v 20</u>: 'When the Prodigal Son was still a long way off'..... his father ran to him showing compassion, welcoming him back to the family. For those who have walked away from God, He does not see them in their weakness, but clothed in the righteousness of Christ, who took their shame upon Himself making them and us right with God.

PayPal Rate Increase

From September 2023 PayPal has begun charging more interest to those who use its PayPal Credit service. PayPal Credit works a bit like a credit card, in that you have a certain limit available and you have to pay off a minimum payment each month.

Amazon adding extra charge for Prime members

Amazon is to start charging Prime members for same-day delivery for orders under £20.

If your order is under this amount, you'll be charged £1.99 for sameday delivery.

At the moment, all items eligible for Prime qualify for free delivery – if same-day delivery is available, you normally need to place your order before midday to get your package by 10pm. Amazon Prime costs £8.99 a month or £95 a year.

Student loans shake-up — For those who started university in September

There are three huge changes

coming to student loans for anyone who started university in England from September. First of all, new students will start repaying their student loans when they earn above £25,000 under the Plan 5 loan. At the moment, you only start repaying when you earn above £27,295 on a Plan 2 loan.

Next, new students will see their loan wiped after 40 years, instead of 30 years, unless they pay it all off before this time. This means most students will spend an extra ten years paying off their loan. The final change will see the interest charged at just the rate of Retail Price Index (RPI) inflation, instead of inflation plus 3%.

November DWP cost of living payment

The Department for Work and Pensions will be paying more than 8 million eligible people £300 this November. The cash will automatically be paid into the bank accounts of those who qualify from the end of the month.

Some sobering statistics from Sept 2022:

- The population of the UK grew by an estimated 777 people a day between 2019 and 2020.
- On average, a UK household spends £4.12 a day on water, gas and electricity.
- 313 people a day were declared insolvent or bankrupt in England in September 2022. This was equivalent to one person every 4 minutes and 36 seconds.
- Citizens Advice Bureau in England dealt with 2,031 debt issues every day in the year to September 2022.
- 6.9 properties were repossessed every day in April to June 2022 in the UK, or one every 3 hours and 28 minutes.
- The number of UK mortgages with arrears of over 2.5% of the rein the year to June 2022.
- The number of people unemployed in the UK fell by 625 per day in the twelve months to August 2022.
- Net lending to individuals and housing associations in the UK grew by £317.9 million a day in September 2022.
- Government debt increased by £466 million a day in the three and 1 month months to October 2022.

- Borrowers paid £139 million a day in interest in September 2022.
- It costs an average of £24.44 per day for a couple to raise a child from birth to age of 18.
- For a lone parent family, the cost of raising a child comes to £29.50 per day.

Consumer Credit Debt

At the end of September 2022, outstanding consumer credit lending was £205.8 billion, rising by £482 million on the revised total for the previous month and £7.0 billion more than in September 2021. Within the total, outstanding credit card debt came to £62.4 billion, an increase of 7.76%(£4.5 billion) in the year to September 2022. Credit card debt averaged £2,245 per household and £1,180 per adult.

Hijacking headlines: how scammers exploit the news agenda:

Fraudsters are quick to exploit major news events to deceive unsuspecting victims.

Scammers can easily set up copycat websites or social media profiles in just a matter of minutes, posing as an organisation currently in the head-lines and using these platforms to trick people into various scams.

One example involves scammers impersonating Ofgem to offer an 'energy bill rebate scheme' to families struggling to meet their payments.

Action Fraud warns of electricity scam emails

Action Fraud has removed 242,000 malicious & dodgy websites, whose scam emails promise free electricity to recipients.

Fraudsters target Halifax customers:

Multiple reports have been received about unsolicited emails from scammers posing as Halifax.

These messages appear to come from Halifax, but the true sender addresses are hijacked TalkTalk and Tiscali accounts.

The scammers used convincing Halifax branding and claimed to be asking customers to 'refresh their contact details' as an extra security measure, inviting them to click a link that redirects to a fake Halifax website.

Legitimate banks will never ask for sensitive information such as your PIN or full password via email.

Anyone who clicks on one of these links will be redirected to a copycat Halifax website created on 20 September 2023 [hlfx-online.com].

Although this fake website may look identical to the genuine Halifax website, the real Halifax domain is [halifax-online.co.uk] not [hlfx-online.com].

Always approach unsolicited calls with caution.

Scammers can be persuasive, so don't trust calls that come out of the blue.

Devon's mobile library services have been given a reprieve.


The cabinet of Devon County Council voted to axe the service in July but they have been told to think again before taking the books-on -wheels service off the road for good.

Now members of a Devon County Council scrutiny committee have voted to send the decision back for a re-think.














Norovirus: what to know about this bug

Winter is on it's way and it's possible there may be a sharp rise in cases of **Norovirus**, sometimes called the **winter vomiting bug**, in the UK. According to the UK Health Security Agency, cases in England were 66% higher than the average last winter, and at their highest level in more than a decade. Surveillance data shows norovirus outbreaks have increased in hospitals, schools, and particularly in care homes. The majority of reported cases are in people over 65.

So what do you need to know about norovirus?

Norovirus was first identified in 1968 as the cause of an outbreak of gastroenteritis in Norwalk, Ohio.

The virus is the most common cause of gastrointestinal symptoms, responsible for about one in five cases of gastroenteritis globally. Norovirus generally causes nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea and stomach pain. Although in most cases the infection clears in a couple of days, it can take longer. The symptoms can lead to dehydration, sometimes requiring hospitalisation, especially in people with weakened immune systems, older adults and children.

Norovirus is highly contagious

People with norovirus are most contagious when they have symptoms, and even during the first few days after they recover.

Norovirus spreads via the faecal-oral route. This means you catch it by accidentally getting tiny particles from the vomit or faeces of an infected person in your mouth. This might happen, for example, if the virus particles land on surfaces you touch, contaminate the food you eat, or if you have direct contact with someone who is infected.

Norovirus can also contaminate food if the food is grown or harvested with contaminated water, for example if fruit and vegetable crops are irrigated with contaminated water or if shellfish are harvested from contaminated water (shellfish can accumulate norovirus in their bodies). Noroviruses are relatively resistant in the environment and can survive for long periods on different surfaces, and at high temperatures.

How can you protect yourself against norovirus?

Unfortunately, there are no approved vaccines or antivirals to combat norovirus, despite significant research efforts. Notably, there are many different strains of norovirus, and its genetic diversity makes the development of effective solutions more difficult.

That said, there are some preventive measures you can take to reduce norovirus transmission.

- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds before
 preparing food, eating and after going to the toilet. Hand sanitisers
 can be used in addition to hand washing, but hand sanitiser doesn't
 work well against norovirus, so hand sanitiser is not a substitute for
 washing hands with soap and water.
- 2. Wash fruit and vegetables well. And thoroughly cook shellfish to an internal temperature of at least 62°C (steam cooking may not heat it enough to kill norovirus).
- 3. If possible, people who are infected should **isolate from others until** at least 48 hours after their symptoms have passed. They should not be involved in any food preparation.
- 4. If someone in the household has gastrointestinal symptoms, routinely
 - clean surfaces and any objects that are touched, such as kitchen counters, doorknobs and remote controls. Gloves should be worn when cleaning and disinfecting. It's also advisable to wear a mask if cleaning an infected person's vomit.
- Thoroughly wash clothes or linen that may be soiled with vomit or faeces of someone who has been infected. Hot water and detergent should be used for washing at the maximum availa-






