HAVE YOU HEARD? '12 Days of Christmas'

There is one Christmas Carol that has always baffled me.

Have you ever wondered about THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS? What in the world do leaping Lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree, have to do with Christmas?

I found out.....

From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a Catholic reality, which the children could remember.

The partridge in a pear tree was Jesus Christ.

Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.

Three French hens stood for faith, hope, and love.

The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The five golden rings recalled the Torah or law, the five books of the Old Testament.

The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Encouragement, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.

The ten Lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.

The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.

I now know how that strange song became a Christmas Carol...

- $\mathbf{1}^{st}$. 1 Chronicles $4 \vee 9$: 'His mother called his name Jabez,' because she gave birth to him in pain, but he refused to let that name define him. He turned to God asking for His approval as HE created, redeemed, called and empowered Jabez. God loved and accepted him—and ourselves—despite the disapproval of others.
- 2^{nd} . Numbers 6 v 27: 'Whenever you bless others in God's name, He himself will bless them'. The habit of blessing others is a powerful and practical way for reconnecting with each other our world and life itself the most phenomenal way possible to lead us to happiness and success. May we bless those we meet today.
- 3^{rd} . 2 Corinthians 12 v 15: 'I will gladly spend myself and all I have for you' said Paul, as he prepared to visit the young church for the third time. Seeing and giving to others in need keeps our priorities right, and prevents us from being self-centred, and rather putting their needs first.
- 4^{th} . Psalm 39 v 1: 'I will put a muzzle on my mouth.' A fool vents all his feelings, but a wise man holds them back, especially when tempted to use foul or abusive language. May everything we say be good and helpful an encouragement and respectful to those who hear them.
- 5^{th} . Romans 8 v 6: To be spiritually minded, is life and peace,' to obey the promptings of the Holy Spirit, even when He guides us to do a certain thing, or to take a risk we would never imagine we would take. It is always wise to submit to His plan, as God knows and will direct our future.



- $6^{\rm th}$. Galatians 5 v 16: "Let the Holy Spirit speak to our hearts telling us to follow Him in obedience, as He knows the path ahead better than we do. This emphasises the previous teaching from Romans 8 encouraging us to follow God's purposes at all costs. - **7th**. <u>Psalm 37 v 34</u>: 'In due season He will honour you.' After we have faithfully understood the stages of our vision:- its birth from God's Spirit our action in preparing our dream to maintain inevitable struggles showing our faithfulness and accept an ever expanding vision.

- 8^{th} . <u>Jeremiah 45 v 3</u>: 'who exclaimed 'I am worn out from sighing and can find no rest.' When it seems the weight of the world is on your shoulders and you feel overwhelmed, cast your worries and concerns on God, knowing He has promised to care for you. Thank Him for being your refuge, a very present help in your time of trouble.
- **9**th. <u>Psalm 32 v 8:</u> '1 will instruct you' Give thanks that God wants to work in and through you to transform you and deepen your relationship with Him by stretching your faith, developing your patience, confronting and conquering your doubts enabling you to trust His process for you.
- **10th.** <u>Matthew 25 v 23</u>: 'Well done, good and faithful servant' from Jesus' parable of the Talents. In spite of our failures, our struggles and limitations, if we are willing to step out in faith and use the gifts God has blessed us with He will see to it that we will succeed in our endeavours for His glory.
- 11th. <u>Psalm 3 v 2</u>: 'Many are saying, "God will never rescue him." No one is far from God and cannot be saved. How-ever they have messed up, the long arm of God's grace can reach out and save them; His power flows through our prayers on their behalf—keep praying and believe God <u>will</u> rescue them.
- 12^{th} . Romans $12 \vee 2$: 'Be transformed by the renewing of your mind,' by NOT conforming to this world, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect WILL of God.' That calls for quality time reading and reflecting on God's Word, talking and listening to Him—embracing His WILL for your life.
- 13^{th} . Psalm 34 imes 7: The Angel of the Lord encamps around those who fer Him, and delivers them.' The apostle Paul in Acts 27 was comforted by an angel who told him not to be afraid and to take heart that his ship and everyone on board would be safe from a storm. For ourselves in the storms of life, be thankful that God is always watching over us.
- 14^{th} . <u>John 14 v 12</u>: 'He who believes in me, the works that I do he will do also.' Follow Jesus' example by being compassionate not condemning as members of His redeemed family we are capable of multiplying His works throughout the world. Aim to produce Christlike qualities:- love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.
- 15th. Esther 4 v 14: You have come to the kingdom for such a time as this.' God's plan all along has been to bring us to where we are now to serve Him using our gifts to minister to others to be a light in a darkened world chosen to have a unique place of service in God's kingdom.

- 16^{th} . Mark 4 v 15: "Jesus said 'As soon as they hear it, Satan comes and takes away the Word that was sown in them." We ask God to help us to hold on to the things He is teaching us through His Word, by practising its principles praying, and sharing it with others.
- 17^{th} . Proverbs 10 v 9: 'Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but whoever takes crooked paths, will be exposed.' Live with an abiding sense of God's peace and security, NOT with a constant fear of being found out. God is patient surrender to Him and He will put your life back together.
- 18^{th} . Ecclesiastes 2 v 24: 'There is nothing better than to find satisfaction in work.' There will be times in life when there is too much to do and not enough time to do it! As long as you insist on doing everything yourself, your productivity will stall and your peace of mind will evaporate. If you are on overload, start making changes pray to God to sustain you, and delegate.
- 19^{th} . Psalm 34×10 : Those who trust in the Lord will lack no good thing.' God's Word tells us to be anxious for nothing, but through prayer and supplication make our requests to Him—maintain our trust in His promises and be thankful.
- **20**th. 2 Timothy $1 \vee 7$: "God has not given us a spirit of fear.' Fear has a mind that thinks and a voice that speaks and if you allow it to it will control you. In this situation fix your mind on God, and cast anxious thoughts on Him. He will never forsake you, and will give you constant peace.m.
- **21**st. Acts 16 v 7: 'Paul and Timothy tried to go to Bithynia but the Spirit did not permit them.' When \underline{we} have a desire to go in a certain direction don't expect God to fulfil it better to let Him set our goals and know we will be heading the right way with His blessing.
- **22**nd. Ephesians 3 imes 10: 'God's purpose in all this was to use the Church to display His wisdom in its rich variety.' 3 challenges the church faces:- to let go of old experiences to allow God to implement a new move. We fear excess and settle for mediocrity, and need to encourage risk takers, and faith walkers.
- 23^{rd} . Genesis $12 \vee 2$: God's promise to Abraham. 'I will bless you make your name great, and you will be a blessing.' Jesus taught his disciples and us today to be distributors of blessing and first responders to those in need.

- **24**th. Ezekiel $3 \vee 15$: 'The prophet sat among the colony of Judean exiles the place where God wanted him to be.' Our most effective ministry to others can come out of some of the experiences we are going through right now, especially the painful ones. Our greatest mess can turn to be our greatest message.
- **25**th. <u>Genesis 2 v 15</u>: 'God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it.' There is a definite sequence which God follows for our lives:- He prepares a place for us He puts us there He tells us to work therein, HE wants us to succeed, leading us the way we should go. Romans 5 v 3: 'Tribulation worketh patience.' We can rejoice when we run into problems and trials, for we know they help us to be patient. which in turn develops strength of character, helping us to trust God more, and giving us a stronger faith. No matter what happens, we know that God loves us through His gift of the Holy Spirit in our hearts.
- **27**th. <u>2 Corinthians 12 v 7</u>: Paul tells us that God permitted the thorn in Paul's flesh 'to keep him from becoming proud.' Increased achievement and success can lead to increased pride and independence from God, who can and does use any situation for our good and His glory. In His wisdom and patience God balances blessings with burdens, by giving us a thorn.
- 28^{th} . <u>Judges 6 v 12</u>: The Angel of the Lord tells Gideon 'The Lord is with you, you mighty man of valour' as he is called to deliver Israel from the Midianites. God spoke to the destiny within Gideon and that the ONE sending him would win the battle. We can face any battle in life because God is with us.
- **29**th. <u>Deuteronomy 2 v 2-3</u>: The Lord spoke to Moses 'You have compassed this mountain long enough turn northward.' Just as the Israelites walked in circles in the wilderness, as if in a rut we too can stray put and get nowhere. Perhaps our rut is comfortable and of our own making who are we following, and do we know where we are going? Ask God to give you a vision for your life and pour your life into it.
- 30^{th} . Nehemiah $8 \vee 10$: The joy of the Lord is your strength,' beware that Satan will do his best to steal your joy he knows it is the spiritual and emotional fuel you run on. In John 15, Jesus yearns that His joy will remain in you, and that your joy will be full.
- 31^{st} . <u>Isaiah 1 v 19</u>: 'If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land.' For ourselves, live according to the instructions God has given us in His Word, and submit to the rule and leading of the Holy Spirit who lives within us. Obeying God leads to peace, progress, protection and promotion.

Minutes of the Meeting of Dunkeswell Parish Council held in the Village Hall on Monday 20th November 2023 7.30 pm

Public Open Session

Drone footage - Drone footage of the area over the building site at Land North of Louis Way was presented. Showing, amongst other things, the increase in size of the mound of earth on the opposite side of the road. The Council are grateful for this information as this will allow them to be able to prove, if required, what level the mound should be returned to. Currently, you can no longer view the large trees at the back of this area and this has impacted the landscape of the area. The program can measure amounts to within approx. a 2cm accuracy. Cllrs Brown and Levine both requested the footage and their email addresses to be forwarded to the Drone operator by the clerk and the information will be provided. Council requested the clerk contact EDDC to find out how long after a notice is served the recipient has to comply with the notice. The Chair thanked the Drone operator for their support.

For the next five months, motorists can park all day in East Devon District Council (EDDC) car parks for just £2. Its winter deal returns on November 1, and will be available until the end of March 2024. The financial incentive is aimed at encouraging people to shop local and support independent businesses. The only car parks not included are Sideshore Car Park in Exmouth, Otter Estuary Nature Reserve in Budleigh Salterton, and Lyme Street in Axminster, as they are managed by EDDC but are owned privately.

Parking at those within the winter deal will be available until midnight. It is hoped that reduced car park charges will help to boost trade throughout the season, especially during the typically quieter months of Jan and Feb.

Old landlines will soon be 'obsolete' – millions of UK homes to face a big change starting November:

Every home in the United Kingdom is about to undergo a once-in -a-generation change in the way they make phone calls.

The substantial shift is due to the replacement of outdated copper infrastructure with digital VoIP conversations that use the internet to keep customers in touch.

It's a massive update that's gradually being pushed out across the country, and we now know where locations will be transitioned from older technology to new internet calling.

Customers will be notified soon, and many are expecting to notice the adjustments in November and December.

Criminals steal £580 million from victims through fraud:

Scammers stole over half a billion pounds from victims through fraud in the first six months of this year, according to UK Finance, increasingly using social media, texts, phone calls and emails to persuade people to hand over cash and personal details. However, the amount stolen was 6% lower compared with the same period in 2022.

Fake online shopping sites

Shoppers seeking online bargains in the run up to Black Friday and Christmas are being targeted by scammers who have built fake websites for some of the most popular brands, such as Cath Kidston.

These scammers are also paying for Facebook and Instagram ads to target social media shoppers who are fans of particular brands, with ads such as '90% off your [insert favourite brand] here'. These sites look and feel exactly like the brand they are pretending to be, but on close inspection you'll find the website addresses and email aren't correct. You also may be encouraged to buy an item as quickly as possible, and to spend more money.

Vehicle scams

Fraudsters set up fake listings on online marketplaces or social media for vehicles that don't exist. When you get in touch, the fraudster asks you for a deposit to "secure" the vehicle and comes up with a reason why you can't see the vehicle beforehand. The fraudster might also pressure you to make a decision quickly by implying they have many other offers.

After you send the money, they block you and delete their profile.

What you can do: Always buy a vehicle from an authorised dealership if you can, as anyone can list anything online. If you are buying online, make sure you have seen and tested the vehicle yourself before handing over any money. Avoid paying by bank transfer and use a debit or credit card – that way, your money will be protected if something goes wrong.

Green home improvement grants scam

Scammers have been known to impersonate government schemes that offer energy-efficient grants and initiatives, such as the Green Homes Grant from 2020 to 2021. Be very wary of tradesmen claiming to install such measures, and wanting your personal details.

<u>What you can do</u>: Don't sign up to anything off the back of a cold call or approach from a tradesman. Look into legitimate schemes, do your research, and get several quotes. You can use <u>Which? Trusted Traders</u>, for example, to find trustworthy tradesmen nearby.

'Suspicious activity on your account' scam

You get a call or text message from someone pretending to be from your bank telling you there's been some suspicious activity on your account, which they will tell you has been frozen. They will ask for your banking details supposedly to confirm your identity and resolve the problem, but use these to steal from you. They may also try to direct you to a fake website to enter your information there.

Often the number that appears on your phone looks legitimate, with scammers using technology to mask their actual phone number.

What you can do: Banks will never ask for your PIN number or your online banking passwords, nor will they ask you to email or text your banking details. Hangup immediately if someone asks for this information.

If you want to check whether it really is your bank contacting you, end the call and telephone your bank from another phone, as sometimes scammers will stay on the line, so that when you redial what you think is your bank, they reconnect with you. If they direct you to a website to enter your details, look at the link carefully and see if it looks suspicious. If in doubt, contact your bank directly and ask them to confirm.

'Payment attempted' scam

You receive a text message or call supposedly from your bank telling you that a payment was attempted from your account to a new payee. The message says that if it wasn't you, you should click on the link shown. This will take you to a fake website where you'll be asked to confirm your banking details. This will then be used to steal money from your bank account.

NB: Your bank will never ask for your bank details, pin or passwords.

And it won't be at the original cash price either, you'll have interest added to pay. **It's just not worth it!**

Devon: Railway Ticket office closure U-turn Midweek Herald

Devon politicians across party lines have cheered the government's U-turn on proposals to close hundreds of train ticket offices.

The Conservative leader of Devon County Council, John Hart, said his authority voted against the closures, while Tiverton and Honiton MP Richard Foord (Lib Dem) said he had raised the issue multiple times in Parliament.

East Devon MP Simon Jupp (Conservative) also expressed concern and said he made his "views clear" about the plans to shut ticket offices in and around his constituency, including Exmouth, Honiton, Exeter St David's, Feniton and Axminster.

In September, Prime Minister Rishi Sunak said closing ticket offices was "the right thing for the British public and British taxpayers" as "only one in 10 tickets are sold currently in ticket offices".

But a public consultation on the proposals to shut 974 ticket offices attracted 750,000 responses, with almost all comments being objections, according to the organisations managing the survey.

Yesterday, Transport Secretary Mark Harper said the government had asked train operators to withdraw their proposals, given the strength of feeling.

Although only around 12 per cent of train tickets are purchased at ticket offices, Devon's more elderly and rural population tends to use ticket offices more frequently than the national average, according to the county council.

"Devon County Council voted unanimously to oppose the closures and lobby strongly for them to be retained," Mr Hart said.

"Devon is a very rural county with a higher than average number of older people who often rely on this service.

"Our cabinet member [for transport], Andrea Davis, who chairs the Peninsula Transport board, has also been very vocal in making our views known to the rail operators and ministers. This is a sensible, commonsense decision."

Meanwhile, Mr Foord, who wrote to South Western Railway and Great Western Railway about the potential impact for his constituency, said the U-turn was a "big win" for community campaigners.

"The scrapping of plans to close our local ticket offices is welcome news as we know how helpful they are to elderly and vulnerable passengers, and the huge benefit that ticket office staff offer rail users," he said. "The question is, why did it take the government so long to act? The damage that these changes would have caused was visible from space. "The public backlash showed a strength of feeling that makes it plain this decision should have been made ages ago."






